Transpose Instruments (3 of 4): Charts

If you have a piece of music written in concert pitch and want to transpose it to any or all of the other transpositions listed, find the same note number in each scale to find the note you should play. Each note is numbered, so finding the same number in each scale will give you the exact same pitch. Then adjust for octave if necessary.

Oboe	Guitar (will sound one octave lower than written)
All keyboards	All pianos
